

Inspired by a local peach farm named Fruitland Nurseries, brands Georgia Peach Vodka and Georgia Peach Tea are being introduced. They will be available in the Georgia market through United Distributors at a suggested retail price of \$29.99.

Fruitland Augusta products are made with real Georgia peaches. Beginning in 1857, Fruitland Nurseries was owned and operated by Prosper J. Berckmans, a Belgium immigrant who became known as the "Father of Georgia Peaches" by inventing several varieties of Georgia peaches. He planted millions of peach trees in his lifetime. Georgia Peach Vodka can be served chilled, neat, over ice or in a variety of cocktails such as
